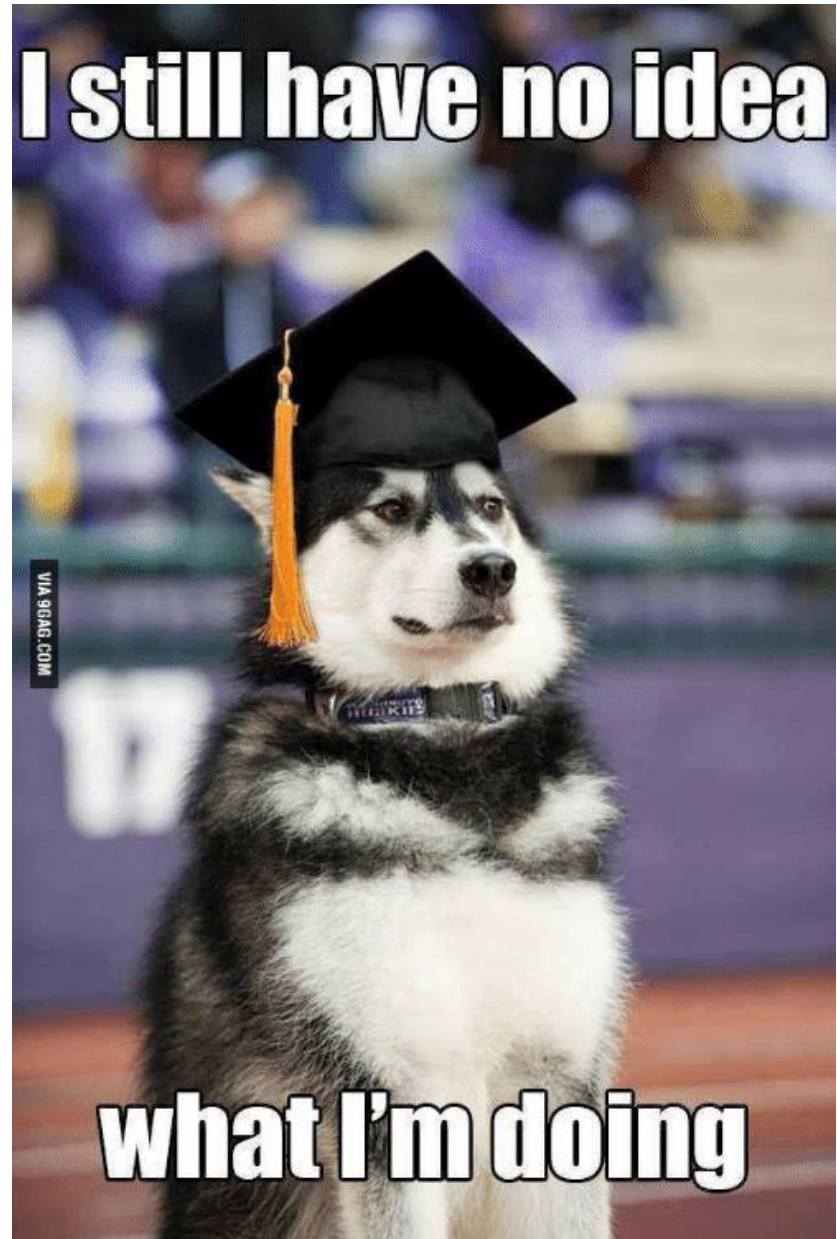

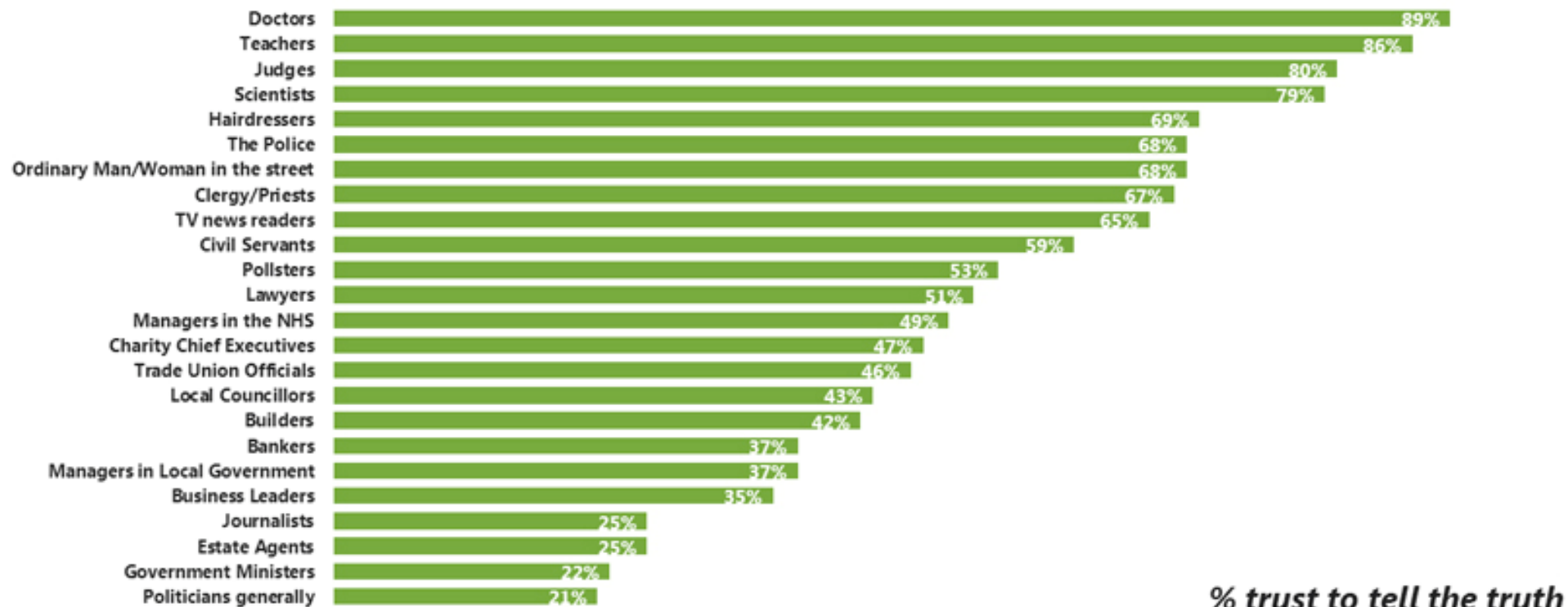
So why do it?
